## **TOM RENICK COUNTY PARK BIRD COUNTS - SEPTEMBER, 2023**

A poor month just 123 species located as against the 139 for 2021. There were 30 surveys involving 180 hours of "field" work. So far this year 241 species located with a total list of 320. The best days were the 15<sup>th</sup> with 867 birds and the 24<sup>th</sup> with 46 species.

There were single Cory's Shearwaters on the 4<sup>th</sup>, 21<sup>st</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup>. There was a Great Shearwater on the 2<sup>nd</sup> with an Audubon's Shearwater on the 22<sup>nd</sup>. Brown Pelicans peaked at 112 on the 9<sup>th</sup>.

There were single American Bitterns on the 24<sup>th</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup>. There were also single Least Bitterns on the 10<sup>th</sup>, 12<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup>. Snowy Egrets peaked at 52 on the 14<sup>th</sup>. There were single Reddish Egrets on the 16<sup>th</sup> and 22<sup>nd</sup>. Green Herons were noted on 20 dates with five on the 18<sup>th</sup> this is a new high count for the park. Single Black-crowned Night-Herons seen on the 11<sup>th</sup>, 22<sup>nd</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup>. Yellow-crowned Night-Herons seen to the 29<sup>th</sup> with five on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and the 3<sup>rd</sup>. White Ibis peaked at 415 on the 15<sup>th</sup>. There were three Glossy Ibis on the 2<sup>nd</sup> with one on the 11<sup>th</sup> and 50 on the 23<sup>rd</sup>. There were nine Roseate Spoonbills on the 15<sup>th</sup> with three on the 18<sup>th</sup>. There were two Wood Storks on the 4<sup>th</sup> with one on the 26<sup>th</sup>. For the vultures there were 35 Black on the 26<sup>th</sup> and 79 Turkey on the 14<sup>th</sup>.

Blue-winged Teal were seen to the  $19^{th}$  with 55 on the  $8^{th}$ . There was a Northern Shoveler on the  $4^{th}$ . There was a Green-winged Teal on the  $6^{th}$  with eight on the  $19^{th}$ . There were 60 Lesser Scaup on the  $28^{th}$ .

There were nine Ospreys flying to the south on the 29th. An immature Snail Kite flew to the north on the 13th (second park record). Bald Eagles seen on seven dates with two on the 3rd. There was a Northern Harrier on the 20th. There were single Sharp-shinned Hawks on the 12th, 24th and 28th. There was a dark morph Short-tailed Hawk on the 1st with a light morph on the 15th. There was a Red-tailed Hawk on the 18th. There were single American Kestrels on the 19th and 24th. Merlins seen from the 6th on seven dates with two on the 17th. There were single Peregrine Falcons on the 21st and 23rd with two on the 29th.

There was a Sandhill Crane on the 13<sup>th</sup>. There was a Semipalmated Plover on the 25<sup>th</sup>. There was an American Oystercatcher on the 8<sup>th</sup>. There were 15 Lesser Yellowlegs on the 17<sup>th</sup>. There was a Marbled Godwit on the 26<sup>th</sup>. 16 Red Knots were seen on the 7<sup>th</sup> with two on the 22<sup>nd</sup>. There were 15 Western Sandpipers on the 25<sup>th</sup>. There were also 25 Dunlin on the 9<sup>th</sup>. There was a Short-billed Dowitcher on the 2<sup>nd</sup>. There were two Red-necked Phalaropes on the 3<sup>rd</sup>.

There was a Parasitic Jaeger on the 3<sup>rd</sup>. There were single immature Long-tailed Jaegers on the 3<sup>rd</sup> and the 28<sup>th</sup>. There was a first-winter Lesser Black-backed Gull on the 27<sup>th</sup>. There were single Caspian Terns on the 12<sup>th</sup>, 14<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup> with two on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 25<sup>th</sup>. There was a Roseate Tern on the 2<sup>nd</sup>. Common Terns were seen on 16 dates with 102 on the 26<sup>th</sup>. There was a Forster's Tern on the 6<sup>th</sup>. Least Terns were seen to the 16<sup>th</sup>. There were two Sooty Terns on the 26<sup>th</sup>. Black Terns seen to the 8<sup>th</sup> with 40 on the 1<sup>st</sup>. There were two Black Skimmers on the 10<sup>th</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup>.

There was an Eastern Screech-Owl on the 26<sup>th</sup>. Great Horned Owls heard on seven dates with two on the 12<sup>th</sup>. The female Chuck-will's-widow was present to at least the 28<sup>th</sup>. There was an Eastern Whip-poor-will on the 16<sup>th</sup>. Single Chimney Swifts were seen on four dates to the 23<sup>rd</sup>. There was a Ruby-throated Hummingbird on the 17<sup>th</sup>. Belted Kingfishers seen on seven dates from the 2<sup>nd</sup> to the 25<sup>th</sup>. There was a Northern Flicker on the 13<sup>th</sup>.

Eastern Kingbirds were seen on 18 dates with 70 on the 11<sup>th</sup>. There were single Gray Kingbirds on the 1st and the 12<sup>th</sup>. One to two Loggerhead Shrikes seen all month. There were two Red-eyed Vireos on the 10<sup>th</sup> with singles on the 24<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup>. There were three Purple Martins on the 5<sup>th</sup>. There were single Tree Swallows on the 24<sup>th</sup> and the 25<sup>th</sup>. There was a Northern Rough-winged Swallow on the 5<sup>th</sup>. There were three Bank Swallows on the 2<sup>nd</sup>. There were single Cliff Swallows on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and the 5<sup>th</sup> with two on the 2<sup>nd</sup>. Barn Swallows peaked at 534 on the 2<sup>nd</sup>. There was a Blue-gray Gnatcatcher on the 9<sup>th</sup>.

There was an Eastern Bluebird on the 8<sup>th</sup>. There were single Veery on the 9<sup>th</sup>, 11<sup>th</sup>, 19<sup>th</sup> and 25<sup>th</sup> with two on the 29<sup>th</sup>. There was a Gray-cheeked Thrush on the 19<sup>th</sup>. Swainson's Thrushes were heard on nine dates with six on the 19<sup>th</sup>. There were single Wood Thrush on the 13<sup>th</sup> and 23<sup>rd</sup>. There was a Gray Catbird on the 7<sup>th</sup>. There was a Brown Thrasher present from the 6<sup>th</sup> to the 10<sup>th</sup>.

There was a Yellow Warbler on the 27<sup>th</sup> with a Yellow-throated Warbler on the 17<sup>th</sup>. There was a Prairie Warbler on the 27<sup>th</sup>. There was a Black-and-white Warbler on the 24<sup>th</sup>. Single Common Yellowthroats were noted on the 13<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup>. There was a Rose-breasted Grosbeak on the 29<sup>th</sup> with single Indigo Buntings on the 14<sup>th</sup> and the 20<sup>th</sup>. There was a Dickcissel on the 26<sup>th</sup>. Bobolinks were heard on 12 dates from the 5<sup>th</sup> to the 29<sup>th</sup> with a high count of 22 on the 27<sup>th</sup>. Finally, there were single Baltimore Orioles on the 23<sup>rd</sup> and 26<sup>th</sup>.
